Duelin' Tom was right there, as was Goode Bascomb, the top lady on the day and 7th overall. Crumville Kid shot the match clean and earned one of MC Ryder's cool knives. Way to go, Kid!

My grandson Zachary Newton, a former Little Buckaroo from a few years back, came out and shot his first match and did very well. I expect we'll be seeing more of him in the New Year. 
First Saturday Shoots Stage a Comeback


