Everybody that reloads, and that's most of us, knows that gunpowder, in particular powders that are good for pistol ammo, can be a bit of a problem to locate. Lucky for me, a couple of years ago when Just George was reluctantly backing away from Cowboy Shooting, he sent out an all-RRV email offering some powder and primers and reloading dies for sale. I bought some primers and dies, but for me the big score was his stock of Trail Boss powder. I have enough Trail Boss to get me quite a ways into the foreseeable future, which is a good thing, because I haven't seen any on any shelf anywhere for a long time. Yes, I know other powders work for CAS, and I've used most of them over the years, but I like Trail Boss.

This month I spent a couple of weeks in Colorado Springs, CO. There is a Sportsman's Warehouse three miles from the kids' house. I went there three times over the course of about a week. I found some rifle powder I need for non-Cowboy stuff, but never saw any Trail Boss, Clays, Unique, AA#2, or Bullseye. Before we headed home my son-in-law took us all out on the I-25 to Bass Pro Shops. The grandkids loved the big fish tank and the mounted trophies, and I found some Unique and Bullseye, so everybody was happy.

I know the big chains get in powder, and I suspect it goes to employees, friends, and relatives, and the general public gets what's left over. Not much you can do about that. On-line giants like Midway, Cabela's, and Brownell's will notify you when they receive what you want. But without fail, in my case, it is get the notice, log in, and it's all gone.
