put on an annual match, about the first thing you worry about is when to do it. The two main concerns, of course, are weather and conflicts. The weather part is a crap shoot. Back when the Nevada Rangers' *Stampede* was a major match, I went several years in a row in the late 90's and early 0's. They did it in April at Jean, Nevada. The landscape is just like ours, and the weather in the spring is just as volatile. I had some great weekends there, and some terrible ones that included high winds, rain, hail, and even snow. We did *DTR* in October at first, tried November, and eventually settled on May and crossed our fingers. Sometimes we got lucky, sometimes we didn't.

Trying to avoid conflicts with other California and Nevada annuals, not to mention the FNRA dinner, school graduations, and the like, was as important as the weather, and there were **lots** of annuals. I know George fielded many calls that went something like, "What?? You're doing your annual the same weekend as *The Great Gopher Gulch Lynch Mob and Jackrabbit Bar-B-Que??* Are you Crazy??"

These days, a look at the Cowboy Chronicle shows three annuals in all of California in October, and one in Nevada. The "small club-level" annual boom has busted, and a lot of people feel there are now too many "big" shoots, with all the state championships, regionals, and divisionals, and that the rapid growth of those matches has played a part in killing off the little guys. Time will tell. And as always, time marches on.
